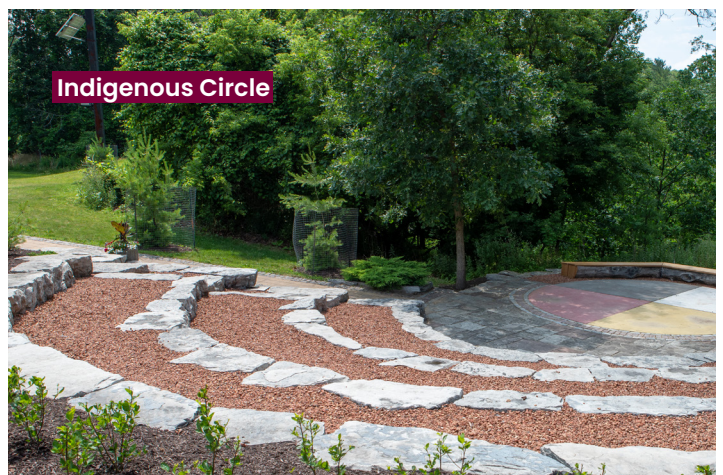

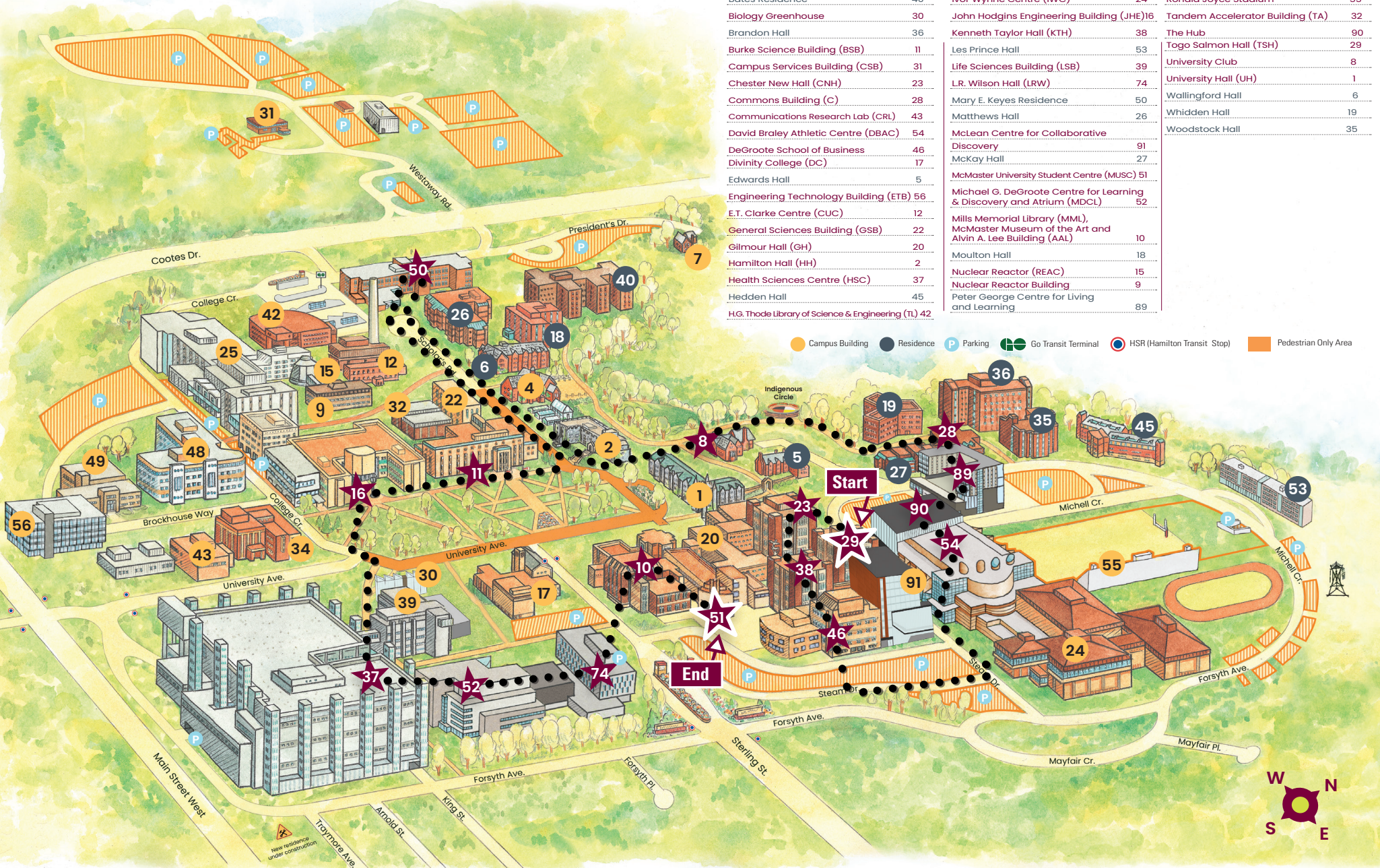

#29. Student Recruitment Office: Togo Salmon Hall Room 111

Welcome to your hub for all things admissions, programs, and campus tours! Drop in Monday to Friday, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., to connect with our Recruitment Officers with all your questions.

#23, 38 & 29. Arts Quad Courtyard

These three identical buildings are connected to each other and the Student Centre via underground tunnels and are home to our Faculty of Humanities, Faculty of Social Sciences and School of the Arts.

#46. DeGroot School of Business

Home to our undergraduate commerce programs and Undergraduate Student Experience Office. The addition of the 10-storey McLean Centre for Collaborative Discovery represents the future of learning and collaborating.

#54. David Braley Athletic Centre

Your ultimate destination for all things athletics, including the Pulse Fitness Centre. With facilities like a bouldering and rock climbing wall, squash courts, an indoor running track and much more, DBAC offers something for everyone.

#90. The Hub

McMaster's newest addition, this 40,000-square-foot student space, is managed by the McMaster Students Union (MSU). It features collaboration suites, multi-faith prayer rooms, a community kitchen and more.

#89. Peter George Centre for Living and Learning

The first three floors house classrooms, including our largest lecture halls, study spaces, an eatery, a coffee shop and our Student Wellness Centre. From the fourth floor and up are student residences.

#28. Commons Building

With 18+ eateries across campus, Commons is home to one of our main dining halls, Centro. Feel free to head in and buy yourself a bite to eat!

#8. University Club in Faculty Hollow

Many buildings in this area were built in 1930 when McMaster first relocated to the city of Hamilton from its original home in Toronto. Nearby, on the northwestern edge of campus, is Cootes Paradise, a large, wooded ravine filled with trails to explore.

#50. Mary E. Keyes Residence

Our suite style residence is located on the west side of campus, conveniently next to the GO Bus Station. Home to Bistro, a large, nut-free dining hall, Bistro-2-GO and Tim Hortons, perfect for quick grab-and-go meals when you're on the move!

#11. Burke Science Building

This building houses our Faculty of Science, featuring classrooms, labs, lecture halls, academic advising offices and the W.J. McCallion Planetarium.

#16. John Hodgins Engineering

As the heart of the Faculty of Engineering, this building houses classrooms, study areas, and departmental offices. Adjacent to it, the Gerald Hatch Centre offers a 28,000-square-foot innovation space, supporting over 5,000 engineering students.

#37. Health Sciences Centre

Attached to the McMaster Children's Hospital, it is home to lecture halls, anatomy labs, a café, bookable study spaces, the Health Sciences Library and one fifth of Albert Einstein's brain!

#52. Michael DeGroot Centre for Learning and Discovery

When class is not in session, visit room 1305/1307, a 616-seat lecture hall often used for first-year courses. Additionally, the nearby waterfall atrium provides a tranquil setting to relax between class.

#74. L.R. Wilson Hall

This Liberal Arts building features a state-of-the-art black box theatre, spacious lecture halls, active learning classrooms, soundproof music practice rooms and various study spaces.

#10. Mills Memorial Library

Mills is our largest library on campus, featuring the Writing and Academic Skills Hub on the second floor and the Lyons New Media Centre on the fourth floor. Each successive floor becomes progressively quieter, culminating in silent study spaces on the sixth floor.

#51. McMaster University Student Centre

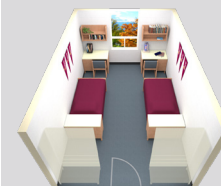

Historic Journey

McMaster University was founded in 1887 in Toronto by Senator William McMaster. In 1930, McMaster University relocated to Hamilton. The move was made possible by the generosity of the Hamilton community, who raised funds to establish McMaster's new home.



Scenic Campus

McMaster's 300-acre main campus is in the scenic Westdale neighbourhood, surrounded by conservation space near Lake Ontario, between Toronto and Niagara Falls. The pedestrian-friendly campus spans a 15-minute walk end to end, with plenty of green space and local trail access.



Vibrant Community

With over 32,000 full-time undergraduate students, McMaster combines the resources of a large-sized university with the warmth of a close-knit community. The campus is home to three libraries, an athletic complex, a nuclear research reactor, a planetarium, the McMaster Museum of Art and numerous Canadian and world-renowned research facilities.
